⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. ⁹ This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. ¹⁰ This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

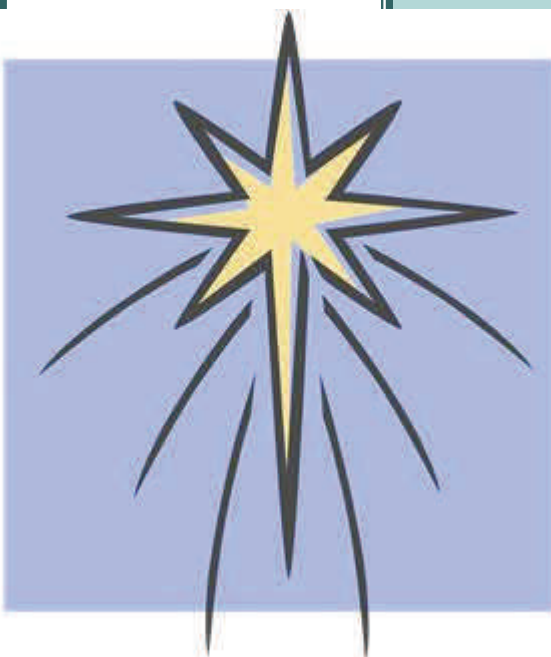
¹³ This is how we know that we live in him and he in us: He has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴ And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. ¹⁵ If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in them and they in God. ¹⁶ And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them.

¹⁷ This is how love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment: In this world we are like Jesus.

¹⁸ There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.

¹⁹ We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen. ²¹ And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister.

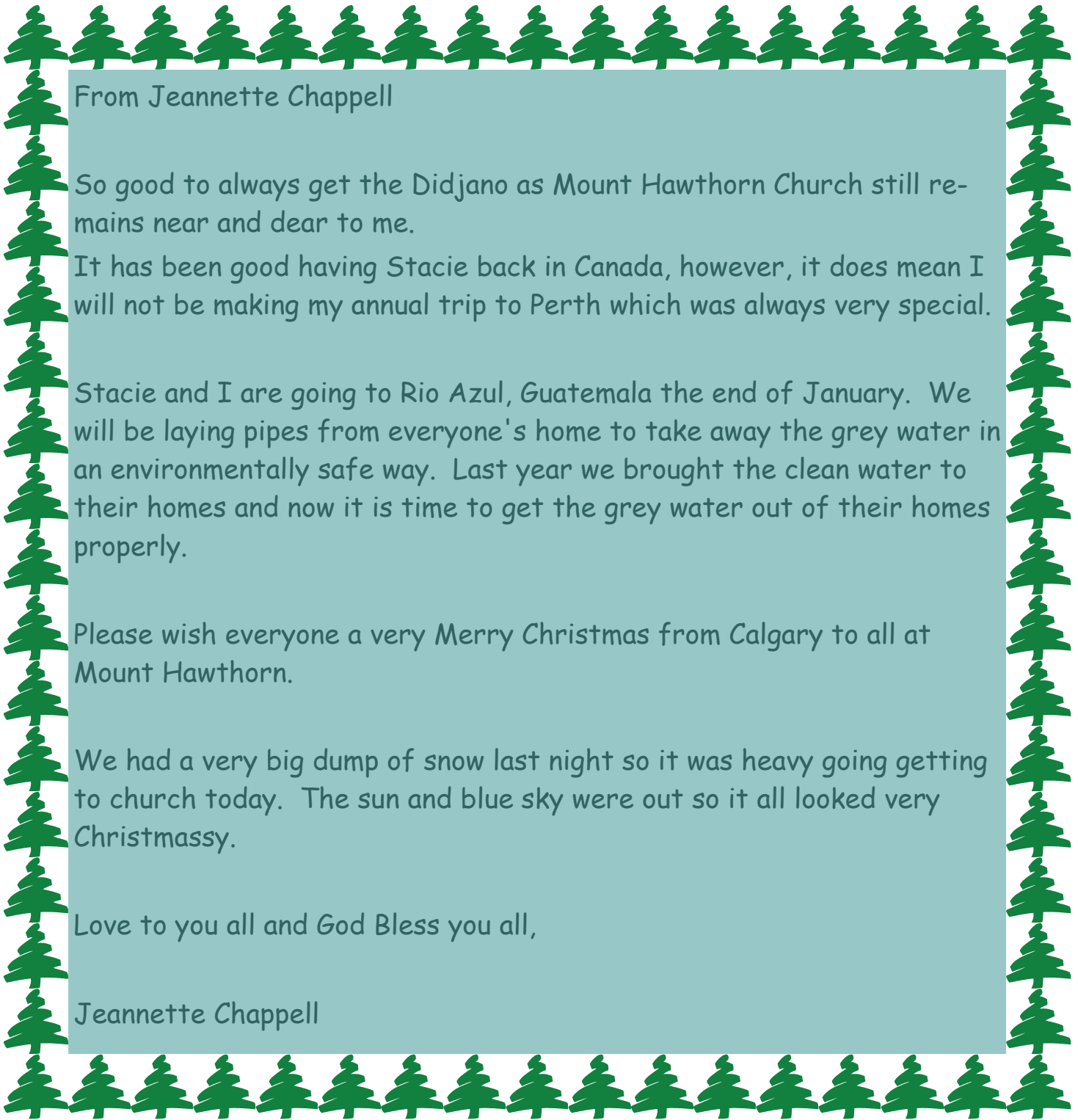
Sylvia Keesmaat and **Brian Walsh** live with their two daughters at Russet House Farm in Cameron, Ontario. On this solar-powered farm they practice animal husbandry and organic gardening. They also offer educational programs, retreats, and conferences on sustainable living.

In 2004 they published their co-authored genre bending and groundbreaking book *Colossians Remixed: Subverting the Empire*.

Sylvia is also the author of *Paul and his Story: (Re)Interpreting the Exodus Tradition* and the editor of *The Advent of Justice*.

Brian's books include *The Transforming Vision: Shaping a Christian Worldview* and *Truth is Stranger than It Used to Be: Biblical Faith in a Postmodern Age* (both co-authored with Richard Middleton) and *Beyond Homelessness: Christian Faith in a Culture of Dislocation*, co-authored with Steven Bouma-Prediger.

His most recent book is *Kicking at the Darkness: Bruce Cockburn and the Christian Imagination*. Sylvia and Brian are currently working on a book project entitled *Romans Disarmed*

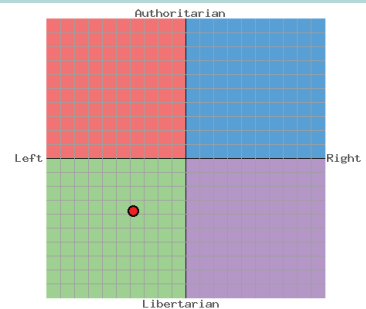
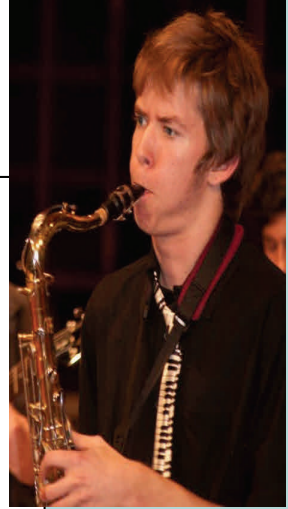
2011 has been a challenging year. I seem to achieve more amazing things every year but this year God has made me look within myself rather than to him. It was only as I wrote this that I worked that out!



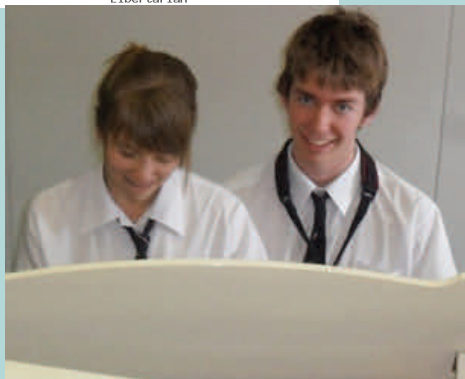
I despise my full name. I feel my abbreviated, preferred name of 'Tim' better captures my enthusiastic, approachable character.
